Walk with Jesus

- Beautfl pntng hung living room GGL's house. Of wooded scene; dirt path winding thru mid forest. On path, man white robe. At his side, 2 discs, going on WWJ. Pretty famous; many seen before. Depcts exctly what takes place in Gos: acct road Ems. Was aftrnn ES. That morn, J risen from dead, appeard MM & other women; that eve, J would appear discs behind lockd doors (last sermon). But that aftrnn, 2 discs, heading for Ems, went on WWJ. And today, as see 2 discs WWJ, might learn thing/2 re own WWJ.
- Vs. 13-16. You know what these 2 talking re: how Teacher/Lord just been arrstd, beatn, crucfd, buried tomb; thought J dead/gone. But all sudn J joined them on road. So 3 them walking tog, but discs didn't realize: J.
- What I'd like you realize today: we're all WWJ. That's what means be Xian. By faith we trust in JC as Sav, risen from dead; so in faith we WWJ. Some you been WWJ short time; come bel smwht recntly. Others WWJ your entire life, since baptzd; you've WWJ as worshpd at ch, as studied God's Word at home, school, SS. And thruout life, J been w/u every step/way. Whether new to Xian faith or not, my enc for you: always WWJ. WWJ even when don't recgnz he's there, bec may be times in life when you (like 2 discs) feel like J gone or abandnd you. Someone you love dies of disease no one know how cure, like cancer or COVID-19; feel all alone. Or your financial footing falls out from beneath feet bec economic collapse; feel helpless, abandnd by J you don't recgnz J w/u. But by faith you know: he's there. By faith, you know: J rose dead; and your remem words: "Peace bwu; don't be afraid; stop doubting & bel." Don't ever think J's left you; don't ever fear he's abandnd you. Instead, WWJ. WWJ even when you feel like he's not walking w/u, bec by faith you know he's there, and you know he always will be.
- So discs walking along; J joins; they don't realize him. Vs. 17. Litly stopped mid road, looked at J in shock. Vs. 18b; then 19a. Surpring see J like this; he's playing dumb; acting like doesn't know what's going on! We know later he'll reveal true identity. But for now, vs. 19a. Clearly not seeking info, as if doesn't know what talking re. So what's he doing? I'll tell you what doing: he's energing these discs, urging them: talk to him, re concerns, share w/him what on minds, unload baggage bec J is interested, J does care, J will listen.
- And today J urges us do very same thing. As we walk road/life w/J, J invites us talk him re concerns, speak in prayer, share what's on minds, unload baggage. And you can bet that when Son/God makes this invttn: J is interested, does care, will listen. So as WWJ, also talk w/J! Major part of WWJ: life of prayer. Prayer to God not re fancy words, elqnt phrases. In fact, some ppl might even feel nervous re speaking to Almighty. But prayer simply talking God, from heart, & knowing listening. So as you WWJ, also talk w/J.
- J asks what talking re. And they: vs. 19b-21a. Hear hoplssnss in words? They thought J dead/gone forever; confsd, disppntd, hoplss; felt like their rel w/J was now thing/past. And so beginning move on. You can tell by way use past tense: was prophet (not sure is anymore); had hoped he'd redeem Israel (not our hope anymore). Beginning to move on from J & see J as thing/past.
- We tend move on when smthng in life reaches a conclsn. Like bball season; played last game; time move on. Or school yr; lot kids can't come school for rest this school year; time move on. That's what these discs doing w/J. He's dead; time move on. And you can see foolshnss in that bec you know J risen from dead. But smtms we too tempted think J: as thing/past; as someone who was imp us in chldhd, earlier in life, but not imp now anymore. Smtmes tempted think: those Bible lessons studied in SS, or Cat lessons studied w/pr, only meant for grade schoolers; and now time's come move on from J. That's how we're tempted! And if you doubt me on this, I can tell you re dozens ppl fallen from faith, moved on from J. Since chldhd they've come church fewer times than fingers on hand. They were WWJ; but then made J thing/past.
- So as you WWJ, make sure J remains not only in your past, but also pres/fut bec it's true, **vs. 19c**. Evrythng you ever learned re J in past, all true: how calmed storms, fed 1000s, healed sick; died cross, rose dead. But now in pres, J still calming storms, feeding 1000s, healing sick; still reminding ppl that did die cross, rise dead for them (incl you!), so that smdy in the fut all bels (incl you!) might be w/him forever in hvn. Jesus is your past, pres, fut. He's been walking w/u all along, is today, will continue walk w/u entire life. Don't move on from J or think he's only part your past. But every day, WWJ.
- So they're sharing their disappntmnts w/stranger (remem, still didn't know: J). And J: vs. 25-27. These discs: weak in faith; doubted res. Like Tom (sermon last wk): wouldn't bel unless proof. But what comfort know: J still came these discs, even in their weakness, and patiently explained evrything them.

- There are plenty times we weak in our faith, just like they were. We doubt J's: love; power; Word. Like Tom, we want proof before we'll bel. And that's a weakness on our part, of which we should ashamed. But in love/patienc J still comes us, even when faith weak J so patient! Fathom for moment patienc of Xp. He's done evrything save us: shed blood, conquered Satan, given this salvin us as free gift/grace. And we have audacity say, "J, I'm not so sure I bel it's true." But J has patienc say, "That's okay; let me explain this you."
- That's exactly what did for disc. **Vs. 27**. And I wish could've been there hear what had say! I'm sure if I could've heard words of J, that've made my weak faith strong. Wait minute I do have words/J, so do you. J does speak us, maybe not in exctly same way did w/these discs. But J does still speak to you/me in his Word, in Scriptrs. When we feel weak in faith, J takes us right back his Word/peace; there explains evrything us. God's Word: foundtn/faith, so when we go back to God's Word every day again/again, when we return to Gos of God's grace thru Xp taught in Scriptr for our salv that's how weak faith made strong.
- Finally make to Ems; vs. 28-29a. So J did. Vs. 30. This not HC, though kind of sounds like it; words pretty simlr. They just hungry travlers, sitting down tog evening meal. But during this CV pandmc while cannot gather tog worship, I just can't help but think (when hear this vs) re our hunger for gathering tog. We long come back church, see one another, hear God's Word tog, & take HC tog, right here in own church. But can't, at least for now. So I pray this pandmc increase our appretn for worshiping tog, hearing God's Word & receiving sacrmnt tog, here church.
- As eating this evening meal, suddenly vs. 31. Realized was him, then vanshd thin air. But that was okay, bec so excited & hearts burning within. So raced back Jrslm tell others, "True! J is risen dead! We've seen!" They walked same path walked earlier w/J, only now were w/o J. Or were they, really w/o J? I submit to you: that J was w/them on their walk from Ems just as w/them on walk to Ems. Maybe couldn't see him; nvrthlss, WWJ. Same true us: may not physcly see J; but every day, as walk road/life (path Xian faith), we're indeed WWJ. That's what road to Ems is all about! J is risen dead! And even if you can't see him, by faith you know there; know: J walking w/u, beside you, never to leave you. My dear sis/bro in Xp, fellow bels in risen Lord/Sav, never stray from path Xian faith as you journey thru this life, but stay close to your Sav, & WWJ.

Luke 24:13-35

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him.

¹⁷ He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" ¹⁹ "What things?" he asked.

"About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. ²² In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. ²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus."

²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together ³⁴ and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." ³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.
