## How Do You Come to Jesus?

- 1) You Cannot
- 2) You Must Be Drawn

## 3) You Eat the Bread of Life

- Ever hrd anyone: we need have CTJ mmnt; or, they really had CTJ mmnt? Ever hrd anyone talk that way? That phrase, CTJ mmnt, has become poplr/seclr catchphrs; ppl who use it really aren't thinkng re J at all. Phrase CTJ mmnt bascly means: wakeup call, intrvntn; when you suddenly realize on wrong path, need stop. So in business wrld, boss may call employee into office, say, we need have CTJ mmnt re your poor perfrmnc. It's: wakeup call, intrvntn. They call it CTJ mmnt when: grp/guys tells alchle buddy stop drinking or else lose job & marg; prnts tell child if keep up this reblls behvr not going be allwd in house; grp/girls tells good frnd she's dating really bad guy, gotta brk up. It's: wakeup call; that's how society uses phrase CTJ mmnt. Now, I actly don't like phrase and don't think we shld use it for 2 reasons: 1) pretty irreverent, sacrilegious even; mocks our dear Sav; 2) J has lot say re actly coming to him. Listen here: vs. 35b; 37; 44a; 45b. Obvs: J really wants us come him; here tehs us how come him. So today, as cont w/part 2 BOL discrs, we have ask: how come J? 3 answrs/qstn; have keep right order. How come J?
- #1, can't. Cannot come J! No one can! If surprises you, listen again: vs. 43-44a not anyone, even most pious prsn you know! Vs. 44a. Well, why not, we ask? Bec sinful nature; bec sinful condtn we born into. "Surely sinful brth...concvd me" (Ps 51:5). This: unvrsl truth; applies all ppl (other than J). We come into wrld w/orgnl sin, which makes us by nature 100% unable come J; there's a sprtn btwn us. Thnk like this: in trck/fld there are jumping evnts. Some ppl can jmp few ft; others quite bit furthr; traind olympc athlts, if get running strt, can jmp pretcly acrss strt. But tell me this: who can jmp acrss Gr Cnyn? MS Rvr? Fox Rvr?! No one. Impssbl; can't be done; just a fact. And it's just as matter-of-factly that J: vs. 44a. Our Luth Cat says exactly same thng. Say these wrds w/me in mind if know them; I think many you do: "I bel that I cannot...or come to him." 3rd Art, explntn. Or how about 2nd rdng, 1 Cor 2: "Prsn w/o Sprt does not accpt thngs that come fr Sprt/God but consdrs foolshnss, and cannot undrstnd them" (14). So when ask how come J, 1st thng have realize: bec of sinful nature, on own, we cannot!
- Hwvr, J goes on say: vs. 44ab. How come J? Must be drwn. What you drwn to? To be drwn to smthng: curious, intrstd, attrctd to smtng/smone captrs your attn; pulled what means be drwn. Boy drwn to girl crush on. Girl drwn to fav sport. We drwn to: certain hobbies, good book, fav vaca getaway. John Muir, Amrcn envrnmntlst, oftn calld "Fr Ntnl Prks", famsly wrote, "Mnts calling, and I must go." He: drwn.
- J: vs. 44ab. God dsn't force you at gunpnt to bel; dsn't thrtn you w/knife to thrt to trust/love him. Draws, invites, beckons, wins you over, woos. It's kinda like 2 ppl falling in love: there's chmstry btwn them, or might say magnte attretn that pulls them tog. That's how God draws us. When Lord opens hrt, tells/ shows loves you, he's drawing you! When you see J coming to you stop, think all ways!; comes to you: as little baby born Bthlhm, hold in arms, embrace his love; in your wtr, joins you in your bap, wshs you clean/sin; in Word, in prbl, prchng, tchng so you can undrstnd mind/love/God; on cross, takes your place on wood, that's where you/I shld've been; outside tomb, when you're all distrght/crying, calls you by name, Mary, Kirk, (insert); in upper rm, peace be w/you, look hnds, touch side, really me, I'm alive/ risen; in sacrmnt, take eat/drnk, really me, I forgive/love you look at all these ways J comes to you! by way, here: vs. 38a; 50a; 51a J comes you to draw you to him. "Come me:" J. That's: chmstry/Gos; magnte attretn of God drawing you to himself. J: I have come to you so that you would come me.
- Again, recall words/Cat: "I bel...or come him. But HS: called me by Gos." He calls you, draws, wins over to bel btfl Gos truth lays before you. Notice: this is wrk of Triune God, FSHS. Here, vs. 44ab; so Fr draws us. In 1 Cor, 2<sup>nd</sup> rdng: "We spk...in wrds tght by the Sprt, explnng sprtl realities w/Sprt-tght wrds" (1:13); so HS draws us. And in Jn 12, J: "And I, when I am lifted up fr the earth, will draw all ppl to myself" (32); so J draws us. The whole Trinity is at work drawing us to love/ bel in him.
- And all/this: God's will; what he wants, more than anthing else: for you love/bel in him. J: vs. 38-39ab. God's will: you saved. Reason God sent J; reason J came dwn fr hvn & came you: so you'd come him.
- But there's whole lot ppl that don't want come J. Even here: vs. 36; 41a, 42a. You can't come J, but can certly rejct! These ppl reject J bec he's too common; grew up w/him, knew his prnts. Has J become too common for you? If you grew up in ch, if know all tchngs, then are you in dngr getting too comfrtbl w/

your Xianity, so that it loses its edge? I've heard it said: oppst/love: not hatred; indiffrnc, when just stop caring, when what was so imp to you in past gradly loses its value/meaning. Is that hapning you? Is your faith/Xp slipping into indiffrnc bec you're so famlr w/J? Anthr: Sun, service, sermon, song. Maybe we need angel/hvn come dwn, smck us upside hd: "Look at what Xp did for you, how came to you!" When you say, 'Amen' or 'Our Fr in hvn' or 'On 3<sup>rd</sup> day rose again fr dead', say it like you mean it!" – bec there's nthng more imp/life Xp crcfd/risen fr dead! That: magntsm, chmstry that draws you to Lord.

- And when that haps, so many blessngs follow! When God draws you, fills you w/: 1) humility (God has done for me what I cld nvr do for self); 2) security (vs. 35; 37b; Jn 8: "Whovr follows me: nvr walk in drknss" [12]; Jn 10: "I give [my shp] etrnl life, and they: nvr perish" [28]; Rom 10: "Anyone who bels in him: nvr be put shame" [11]; Heb 13: "Nvr will I leave you, nvr forsake" [5]. That's a pwrfl wrd (nvr), and God doesn't use it lightly; but when he says nvr, that fills us w/security); 3) thankflnss (God has done evthing for me bec loves me!); 4) desire/longing to come to J, be w/him forever.
- So, how you do that? How come J? Way you come J: you eat BOL. Remem, this: part 2 of 3 of BOL discrs. J: explnng/expndng what means that he is true brd that comes dwn fr hvn to feed our hungry souls. It's a profind metphr w/simp meaning: to come to J = eat BOL = hear/bel his Word! All mean same thing! Vs. 35. Coming to J & belvng in him: same thing as vs. 45b. So when you learn fr Fr, when hear/bel GW, you are: eating BOL, coming to J. Msg/BOL dscrs is pretty simple; J: come to me & eat my Word. Says same thing in 1<sup>st</sup> rdng, Prov 9: "Come, eat my food and drink the wine I have mixed" (5). When you: come ch, come BC, listen carfly to rdngs & pay attn to sermon, read/devour GW & bel what says, then you are: eating BOL, coming to J!
- And this is what J wants for you, not only for this life, but also for etrnl life. You can't miss how J, 3x here, says: vs. 39; 40; 43. There's a day coming when you'll be dead/buried in your coffin/urn/grnd. And J will: raise you up; resurrect fr dead; put your body back tog; perfect/glorify it; and you'll live the etrnl life God has been preparing for you since before born. J: BOL, after all! Vs. 51b. And that is you; he's talking re you. J came to you so that you would come to him, eat him, live forever.
- The crwds who 1<sup>st</sup> heard these wrds cld've had what you might call CTJ mmnt. But didn't bec refused to bel. How do you come J? On own, can't. But Trinue God has drwn/wooed/brght you to faith/Xp, so that now your only desire: come J & eat BOL. Next Sun, J wraps up BOL dscrs; and Pt exclms: "You have wrds etrnl life" (68). Today J invites you: eat those wrds, come to J, bel in him, and life forever.

## John 6:35-51

<sup>35</sup>Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. <sup>36</sup>But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. <sup>37</sup>All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. <sup>38</sup>For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. <sup>39</sup>And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. <sup>40</sup>For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day."

<sup>41</sup>At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." <sup>42</sup>They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"

<sup>43</sup>"Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus answered. <sup>44</sup>"No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. <sup>45</sup>It is written in the Prophets: 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from him comes to me. <sup>46</sup>No one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father. <sup>47</sup>Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life. <sup>48</sup>I am the bread of life. <sup>49</sup>Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. <sup>50</sup>But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die. <sup>51</sup>I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."
