2019 Wisconsin State Tuition Deduction

As you prepare to file your state income taxes, please remember to take the Wisconsin State Deduction for tuition which you paid in the 2019 calendar year. Any payments made during the calendar year for tuition for students grades K-12 may be deducted from income for state income taxes. This amount includes fees, as well as the purchase of chromebooks. To find out the amount paid, simply log on to your TADS online account and download a statement of your paid 2019 invoices for the year. If you paid via check, your cancelled check is your receipt.

Cash payments can use the cash receipt or request a tuition paid letter from the school office. These receipts, along with Wisconsin form PS, will allow you to take this deduction. If you should have any questions on this deduction, please contact the school office or Mr. Avery.

Cold Weather Dress

Now that colder weather is here, students should have the proper outerwear when going outside for recess. Students in grades K-4 will be required to wear boots, snow pants, hats and mittens when playing in the snow. If a student forgets or doesn't wear boots or snow pants, he or she will be allowed

to go outside, but will not be allowed to play in the snow. Students in grades 5-8 will be required to wear boots when playing in the snow. Students will be going outside unless it is raining or sub-zero temperatures are present.
