

#### Choirs Starting Up J

# **Directory Information**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) allows schools to classify certain information as "directory" information. When so classified, the school has the right to disclose the information without parental consent. St. John's School Board has classified the following student information as "directory": Name, address, telephone number, date of birth, family members, honors & awards, attendance, participation in extracurricular activities, picture, height & weight of athletes. Parents who object to having any one or more of the directory items made public should contact the principal in writing, listing the areas they wish to remain private. Examples of where directory information might be made public: yearbook, school newsletters, local newspapers, sports programs.
