

Fall MAP Schedule

Our 3rd through 8th graders will be working on three different standardized tests during September 23-27. These math, reading, and language arts tests from NWEA MAPS help to identify student's individual areas of strength or weakness. This year, classroom teachers will also use the results to help each of these students with individualized learning and practice. Using the online service from "Study Island", teachers will connect the MAPS test results throughout the year to help students where they most need a boost.

This year our choirs are working backwards. We hope this necessary switch will not be overly burdensome. Sunday School and Bible Study

Another way we stay connected with Jesus is by being a part of Bible study and Sunday School. Our Sunday worship times are 8:00am and 10:30am, which gives us 9:15am-10:15am as our Sunday Bible study hour. The Sunday School serves disciples from Preschool through 12th grade. Also returning this year we have our Adult Sunday School! The Adult Sunday School will be taught by lay leaders in our church and will cover the same lessons taught in the youth Sunday School. Parents can hear and discuss the very same Bible lesson as their children. What a great opportunity for family discussions on Scripture! The other Adult Bible Class will pick up with the Gospel of John. A new Adult Bible Class will also start later in 2019.

Hot Lunch

The first hot lunch account statement should have arrived by email today. If you didn't receive yours, please send a specific email address to the office for us to use. Any lunch account balance from last year has been carried over to this year for you. Parents may purchase hot lunches daily or bank money for multiple future lunches. Each hot lunch costs \$3.00 and a second entree serving may be purchased for \$.50. Payments can be brought to the school office.

Directory Information

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) allows schools to classify certain information as "directory" information. When so classified, the school has the right to disclose the

information without parental consent. St. John's School Board has classified the following student information as "directory":

Name, address, telephone number, date of birth, family members, honors & awards, attendance, participation in extracurricular activities, picture, height & weight of athletes.

Parents who object to having any one or more of the directory items made public should contact the principal in writing, listing the areas they wish to remain private.

Examples of where directory information might be made public: yearbook, school newsletters, local newspapers, sports programs.

Immunization Reminder

The school office must file an immunization report with the state in the upcoming weeks. A complete immunization record or reason for the incomplete record needs to be on file for each student. Annually grades PK, K, and 6 are required to turn in the updated immunization records. If you haven't done so already, please turn them into the school office as soon as possible. Extra reminders may soon be coming to your "inbox".

School Board

The School Board at St. John's has a practice of inviting parents and students or other interested parties to attend the School Board meeting at least twice during the school year. These meetings of the School Board will include a 30 minute "Open Forum" segment to allow St. John's family members the opportunity to have time with the School Board if desired. This portion of the meeting will include the opening devotion, and then opportunities for questions to be asked of the board. The Board will then move on to the rest of the agenda in closed session.

These open meeting dates have been scheduled for November 14, February 13, and April 16 at 6:30pm. This interaction with the School Board is designed to create more opportunities for open communication with the leaders at St. John's.
